

Year 2 Start to the Year



Looking forward to a fantastic year!




Year 4 Start to the Year

We are having an absolute blast!














The Year 5 community are enjoying a wonderful Start-Up program, getting to know one another and establishing the routines and expectations that will set us up for a fabulous year!



We are so excited to see what the rest of the year has in store!














The year 6s have acclimatised to their new learning environments smoothly and are starting the year strong!

- The Year 6 students are drawing sketches of important moments in their lives.




Performing Arts Start to the Year


