Calm Club






Dreamtime at the G!

Kiss 'N' Drop Zone





Between 8am- 9am the Kiss N Drop zone is a No Parking Zone.

The Kiss and Drop Zone is an area near the school gates that enables you to drop your child off SAFELY and QUICKLY.

The intention is that parents do not park in this zone and that they stay in their vehicle so that traffic is streamlined and queues are minimised, a maximum of 2 mins is allowed for drop off.

If you wish to walk your child to class please park in appropriately signed areas located around our school. This helps with moving traffic safely through our shared zones and ensures the safety of our staff and students.

Please note that Council inspectors do patrol the Kiss 'n' Drop zone and the parking zones surrounding the school from time to time and will issue infringements to those found to be in breach of the rules.
